Introduction

Last World Championships within the XXIX Olympiad

After almost four years campaigning in the XXIX Olympiad, sailing athletes will measure strength at their last World Championships prior to the Olympic Sailing Regatta, taking place next Summer at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. The World Championships in the International 470 class, the class representing the "two person dinghy" for both men and women at the Olympic Sailing Regatta, will take place from 21 to 30 January on Port Phillip Bay near Melbourne in Australia.

Reigning World Champions Nathan WILMOT and Malcolm PAGE from Australia (470 Men) and Marcelien DE KONING and Lobke BERKHOUT from the Netherlands (470 Women) will have a tough job defending their Worlds title and fight, to claim the Worlds title to their names for the fourth time.

During the last few years, many different crews in the international 470 class racing scene from different nations and continents as well, have managed to climb the podium at International 470 Class Championships and major events. With their proven ability to win races, they will push it hard to break the resp. Australian and Dutch leadership.

Having this trend of changing leaders in mind. it looks like the number of contenders for the Worlds title is higher then ever.

Competition around the globe

470 World Championships have taken place on different continents the last three years, (USA 2005, China 2006, Portugal 2007), and now the action is brought to Australia, with 153 entries from an impressive number of 38 representing nations.

Nations still in the race to qualify and represent their country at the 2008 Olympic Sailing Regatta.

Besides the challenge for the Worlds title, this event will decide on the remaining 25% of country qualifications for the Olympic Sailing Regatta. 29 crews will start at the Olympic Sailing Regatta in the men's two person dingly, and 19 in the women's.

men's two person dinghy, and 19 in the women's. At the ISAF Sailing World Championships last year in Cascais, Portugal, 22 countries have already qualified in the 470 Men and 14 in the 470 Women.

A hot competition for the Olympic dream, meaning for the 7 remaining places in the men's 470, will establish between 15 nations that have not qualified. In the women's 470 it will be even harder, where 17 nations will compete for only 5 remaining places.

Support to Olympic dreams

To ensure that all nations around the World got a chance to qualify for the 2008 Olympic Sailing Regatta, 470 Internationale launched the 2008 Olympic Pathway Solidarity Grant programme in 2006.

With a 30.000 euro budget and great efforts, this programme provided in equipment, training and coaching support at the first qualifying event, the ISAF Sailing World Championships in 2007, and provides financial support for transport and charters at this last qualifying event, the 2008 470 World Championships.

The support is provided to crews from nations admitted to the programme by proving to have financial obstacles to take a chance for country qualification.

This makes a total of 50 nations from all continents that have been, and still are competing for participation at the Olympic Sailing Regatta this Summer where only 29 starting places are available in the 470 men, 19 starting in the 470 Women.

New young talent, oxygen for the sport on the long run.

The entry list of this World Championship also shows that preparations for the 2012 and following Olympic Sailing Regatta's have already begun.

Many countries send a second or a higher number of crews in both the men and women's fleet, which are often top performing crews from the junior scene.

About the Event

EVENT GRADE

The 470 Class fulfills the two person dinghy sailing sport discipline for both Men and Women at the 2008 Olympic Sailing Regatta.

ISAF Grade W

Because the 470 carries an Olympic status, a World Championship is granted with the ISAF Grade W, which is the highest grade after the sailing regatta at the Olympic Games.

The winners of the event, resp. Men and Women will receive the title of:

470 Class Men's World Champion

470 Class Women's World Champion

THE FORMAT IN A NUTSHELL

The 470 Worlds Men & Women are strictly two separate events. Both the Men and Ladies Fleet will race on separate courses to make sure that racing will not be influenced by each others presence.

The race format for each Fleet is the same. Each Fleet (Men & Women) will be split up into groups, as close to the number of 35 per group.

All groups will race six qualifying races during three days, with two races a day on the schedule. The groups will be changed each day.

After three days of qualifiers, the best 35 teams of each Fleet will proceed the event in the so called Gold Fleet, the remaining boats in a second Silver Fleet and third Bronze Fleet, if applicable. All teams will have seven races in the finals, (the Medal Race included.)

On the last day, the top ten of each Gold Fleets Men & Women will decide the World Championship in the highlight of the event: The Medal Race.

ABOUT SAIL MELBOURNE



The 470 World Championships are organized by, and is part of Sail Melbourne, one of the most well known and biggest and professional events in the World for International and Olympic Classes.

MELBOURNE is renowned as a city for major events including the Commonwealth Games, the Australian Tennis Open, F1 Grand Prix and Sail Melbourne. Sail Melbourne was established by Yachting Victoria in 1994 with funding assistance from the State Government of Victoria. It is now recognized as the number one sailing event for Olympic class sailing in the Southern Hemisphere. Mark Turnbull OAM, at 34 the world's youngest Chairman of an International Sailing Federation Grade 1 regatta and 2000 Sydney Olympic Gold medalist, is thrilled with this recognition.

"Sail Melbourne 2008 dominates the ISAF calendar leading up to the Beijing Olympic Games and Melbourne clearly has the attention of the world yachting community for an intense three to four week period in the crucial lead up to the Olympic regatta in Qingdao in August, "Turnbull says.

"Sail Melbourne 2008 is rivaling the 1999 Worlds in sheer scale, and that event did a huge amount for the recognition of sailing, both in Victoria and around the world."

Racing will be conducted on Port Phillip Bay, which is recognized as one of the world's best open expanses of water for sailing. Excellent summer conditions include regular sea breezes averaging 15 knots, minimal tidal influences and 20 degree Celsius water temperatures. Port Phillip will be the perfect place to select the next champions of the world.

About the 470 Class

History

The 470 was designed in 1963 by Andre CORNU (FRA) as a modern fiberglass planing dinghy with trapeze and spinnaker. In 1969 the class was given international status and has been on the Olympic programme since 1976, sailing initially as an open event.

The 470 was the first dinghy of the modern Olympic era, could accommodate light and medium weight crews and be sailed as effectively by men as women.

In 1988, the IYRU (now ISAF) created the first women's only event and selected the 470. In parallel a men's two person dinghy event was created, also using the 470.

Today

The 470 Class fulfills the Olympic 'Two Person Dinghy' sailing discipline for both Men and Women. The strict one design class has proved its excellent suitability as an Olympic Sport during 12 Olympiads (8 for Men and 4 for Women) because of its characteristics as a high performance sailing dinghy, suitable for human athlete body-weights from all continents, and very capable performing in most weather circumstances.

High activity around the World

The 470 Class knows a high activity from Junior to Senior sailing in more than 70 countries spread over 6 Continents, with almost 40.000 boats built since the 60's. Five International Championships in strict accordance with the guidelines of the International Sailing Federation (ISAF) are carried out annually. (World & European Championship, Junior World & Junior European Championship and Masters Cup. The 470 Class Association (470 Internationale) is managed both by volunteers and by paid persons, in order to provide a complete range of management during the entire year.

The current World Champions are known as heavy air specialists, although showed they are fast in all conditions with a win in the light conditions at the 2006 Worlds. In their home country they have won almost every national sports award available, and in 2007 they were internationally nominated for the ISAF World Sailor of the Year award in 2007. The Dutch Women have the amazing ability to push it hard at events that they choose, and take serious leads over the fleet at moments that pressure rises.

Career Highlights: 2006 ISAF World Sailing Games gold medalists, silver at the 2007 470 Worlds. The French 470 crew have been amongst the top players in the class for over six years now and are an almost constant feature around the top of the leaderboard. Strong across a range of conditions and have put in some good performances last season.

Christine BASSADONE / Saskia CLARK | Great Britain (GBR)

Age: 26 and 28

ISAF World Sailing Ranking: 6

Career Highlights: Silver at 470 Worlds 2005, Bronze at 470 Worlds 2007

These Ladies from Great Britain leave the 420 class successful by winning the Ladies Worlds Championships in 2000 and start sailing 470's. Only in 2004 they start to get eyes focused on them by winning silver at the Semaine Olympique Française and a seventh place at the Athens 2004 Olympic Regatta. From then, it seems they find their way on top in the 470 Women's Fleet and become contenders for Championship titles.

Career Highlights: Gold medalists Olympic Test Event 2007, 3rd Open 470 Europeans 2007 The Australians are one of the youngest and most talented teams participating in the Intl. 470 class scene. They have an impressive record of national and international youth sailing titles, highlighted by a trio of victories in 2004 at the Volvo Youth Sailing ISAF World Championship (RECHICHI also won in 2003), the 420 Women's Worlds and the 470 Junior Worlds. In August last year, they climbed the podium for a Gold medal at the Olympic Test Event.

Giulia CONTI / Giovanna MICOL | Italy (ITA)

Age: 22 and 25

ISAF World Sailing Ranking: 1

Career Highlights: Silver medalist at 470 Europeans 2007

Looking at the performance of the Italians over the last few months, they merit high expectations. Giulia CONTI and Giovanna MICOL only started in the class in 2006 but were quick getting up to pace. Despite being just 22, CONTI is already an experienced sailor on the match racing circuit and competed at the Athens 2004 Olympics in the Yngling class.

Career Highlights: silver medalists 470 Worlds 2006, silver medalists Olympic Test Event 2007 Asia's best performing 470 team always gives strong competition at major events. Looking at their career highlights, circumstances on Chinese waters seem to suit them very well, which makes them favorite for an Olympic medal at the Olympic Sailing Regatta this Summer. In heavy conditions last year at the ISAF Sailing World Championships, they also showed to be very competitive by taking an overall fourth place.
